

# Feeling Face Instructions



- Color your paper plate (I colored mine yellow to look like an emoji, but you can color yours the color of your skin if you like)
- Cut out and color the mouth, eyes, and eyebrows.
- Attach the facial features to the paper plate using the paper fasteners.
- Draw a nose and any other features you want on your face.
- Turn the facial features to make different emotions.

## Parent Tip:

Give your child time to move each of the elements on the face to change the feelings. After moving each one of the features, have your child share how that changes the feeling it displays. By changing the eyebrows on the smiling emoji, it can go from looking happy to mean. You can also name a feeling and then have your child move the eyebrows, eyes, and mouth so the emoji will display that feeling.
