

Weather Instructions



- Cut out the sun, snowflake, and umbrella.
- Color the sun, snowflake, and umbrella with crayons.
- Using a black marker (or crayon) draw a line straight down the middle of the paper plate. Draw another line perpendicular to the first line.
- Glue the sun, snowflake, and umbrella each in a different section of the paper plate.
- Take the cotton ball and pull it apart so it looks like a cloud. Glue it to the paper plate in the last section.
- Cut out "Today's weather is..." Glue it to the clothespin.
- Look outside. Put the clothespin on whatever section the weather is today.

Parent Tip:

Making observations about the weather and discussing climate are great ways to teach children about science, especially since weather is something children can easily relate to and understand. Weather and climate affect children's lives every day.
